Dear Professor Steindorff.

I am today sending you, under separate cover (a cardboard cylinder), inked-in squeezes of all the inscribed stones from Anibeh in this Museum with the exception of E. 1136% (stela of Mrj) the material for which I sent you on Oct. 13th last. These stones are Nos. E. 11356-11366, 11368-11370, 16201; I enclose a list of them, with the necessary details.

Please note that on these squeezes the signs given in broken lines ---- are visible on the photographs (of which I sent you prints on Dec. 24, 1931) but have disappeared from the stones themselves. Perhaps, in order to save space, you will prefer to cut away the edges of the stones, leaving only the lines of inscription between their framing-lines (as has been done with the squeezes of E. 11357-11358).

There is also the inscribed stone No. E. 11371, with an inscription of Ramesses II, described by Woolley in his Catalogue as "found on the site of the temple of Ramesses II on the West bank opposite the North bluff of Kasr Ibrim". I sent you a photograph of this on Dec. 24, 1931, and wrote to you about it on Jan. 25, 1932 and you wrote to me on Jan. 3, 1933, that you would be glad to receive a copy of it. A squeeze is now being made, and will be sent to you in a few days, I hope.

Under separate cover I am also sending you today Woolley's Catalogue, which you may like to see.

I also enclose transcriptions of the ink-inscriptions (hieratis), so far as I have been able to make them out, on the two wine-jars Nos. E. 11258, 11324. These inscriptions are not only very cursive but also in places very hard to see, being partly effaced; some of the inscription on E. 11258 further seems to be palimpsest.

I also enclose a list of objects from Anibeh catalogued by (62w. identified)
Woolley, but not now to be found here.

This, so far as I know, absolutely completes the material from Anibeh itself.
