Dear Dr. Steindorff:

We are forwarding to you herewith four sets of galleys (18-32 inclusive) of your KOPTISCHE GRAMMATIK together with the manuscript, received from Dr. Augustin yesterday.

We have learned that you have made extensive alterations in the first batch of galleys sent to you — alterations varying from copy as submitted.

You will recall that there is an agreement between you and ourselves that your alterations varying from copy cubmitted must not exceed a total cost of \$300.00. We hope soon to have the exact quotation of the cost caused by your alterations so far.

You will forgive me for returning to the subject at this moment. But I feel it is important for you to keep the agreement and alteration costs in mind. Should your alterations at any time threaten to exceed the sum of \$300.00, we will have no alternative but to stop work and instruct J. J. Augustin to stop work until somehow funds could be found to cover the excessive bill. This might mean an indefinite delay.
