Dear Professor Steindorff:

We have recently talked with Mr. J.J. Augustin concerning the possibility of his printing your Coptic Grammar. Mr. Augustin expressed himself willing and eager to undertake the printing of the Grammar through his printing plant in Glueckstadt, Germany. He assured us that his plant has all the necessary type faces at its disposal, and suggested that we have the manuscript sent to New York as soon as possible, so that he may go over the problems involved, with his sister, who is here now, and will return to Germany on August 15th. He suggests that she take the manuscript with her to Germany, with his instructions, in order that an estimate of costs may be made by the Glueckstadt plant.

It is, of course, of the utmost importance that the complete manuscript be microfilmed before the original is sent on. I believe that this process does not take very long. When you are ready to send the manuscript, would you be good enough to address it to this office, so that we may go over it together with Mr. Augustin.

We hope that this method of procedure will meet with your approval.
