Dear Professor Steindorff,

I am glad to hear from my former Assistant, Miss Moon, that the coloured photograph of the Stela of Mery (E. 11367) has been sent to you. I hope it is satisfactory for your purpose.

As regards the three finger-rings, about which I told you I would ask for further details, Miss Moon tells me that E 11070, of green jasper, is quite plain (not inscribed in any way); and that E 11157A and E 11191 are very crude and that it is hardly possible to make out what these two rings have on their bezels. "The former," she says, might have a fish, although if I turn it another way it suggest Thoueris. E 11191 may possibly have a head of Hathor, but I should place queries after that. E 11157B cannot be made out."

I understand that we sent you full measurements of the pottery in every case.

E 11172 is, as I mentioned in my previous letter, of mf dark, brown-black glaze; the inscription and framing-lines are of a gray-green rather than a dark green. I enclose a photograph of the object, as seen from the side. I am sorry the print is somewhat crumpled. I asked for a drawing, but received this photo. If you require a drawing, no doubt I can get one for you.

I should be very glad to hear that you duly received my previous letter, written at the end of last year, and containing some details about objects.

I hope all goes well with you, as it does with me, and that the publication of the New Kingdom material from Anibeh is making satisfactory progress. I am very happy here, though busier than I have ever been before in my life!
