Dear Professor Steindorff:

I am so glad the colored photograph of the Stela of Meri is satisfactory. Miss Baker was much pleased with your comments.

The photographer now has E 11190 "inlay", in hand and I shall mail you the photo as soon as possible.

As regards E 11135, I do not believe there ever were any more pieces in the Museum. There are nine numbered and one without a number (which is in the box with the others), photos of which I believe you have. Dr. Fisher, in our catalogue, mentions "blue face, red legs and arms". There is no record of the actual number. I have been unable to locate any more.

I am quite surprised to learn of the possibility of there being any mirrors, combs or hairpins from Aniba. If I remember correctly they are not mentioned by Woolley in his catalogue of the material, which you have. We appear to have no record of any such objects here. Yesterday I went down to the store-

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room and looked over all the Nubian material but without success. What do you suppose could have happened to them?

I am wondering if you would be good enough to answer a question for me. Am I correct in classifying E 11166, Photos 2908, 2909, as an amulet? We are rearranging our exhibit of amulets and I had planned to use that object but I notice that our catalogue does not list it as one.
