As soon as I have a little time I will make you a copy of the inscription of Ramesses II, said by Woolley to have come from the "site of the temple of Rameses II on the W. bank opposite the N. bluff of Kasr Ibrim". Whether Woolley has made a mistake in this

statement I cannot tell; there is no mention of such a temple in Baedeker!

There is no general Lageplan of the N.K. tombs excavated by Woolley. See my letter to you of January 26, 1932, middle of page 2. I will send you Woolley's ^{cards containing the} original sketches of the chambers etc. as soon as I can spare them, that is, as soon as I sure I shall no longer have to refer to them for the material which I am sending you.

If you go to Egypt this spring, please let me know your address there, so that I may correspond ~~with~~ with you direct. I also should be glad to hear from Newberry, having had no answer to my letters since I left Egypt.
