Dear Professor Steindorff,

Your letter of Oct. 17th arrived this morning, and I hasten to reply to the various questions you ask therein. Your letter has crossed with mine of Oct. 13th last, which contained details regarding all scarabs (including heart-scarabs) and scaraboids; by now you will have received that letter, I hope, and will have found a number of your questions of Oct. 17th answered therein. However, it will perhaps be best if I answer here all your questions of Oct. 17th.

1. I send you herewith duplicate prints - all that we have by us here at present - of the following photographs of scarabs:-  
898, 899A, 899B, 2822, 2829, 2909, 2910. Prints of the others, namely 897, 2823 to 2828 inclusive, and 2830, will be made and sent to you as soon as possible.

2. Scarab E. 11082: see Photo. 2909, sent Sept. 11th 1933, and <sup>then and</sup> details sent Oct. 13th 1933. Scarab E. 11083 has not been found here; it is described by Woolley in his Catalogue as "Plain ((i.e., un-inscribed)) dark blue glass scaraboid". Button-seal 11099: see Photos. 2909, 2910, sent you Sept. 11th 1933 and details sent on that date.

3. Scarab E. 11024: see Photos. 2909, 2910, sent Sept. 11th 1933, and details sent on that date and again on Oct. 13th 1933.

4. The scaraboid found in An. 26, Chamber A, has no catalogue ("E") number; it is probably the one of which a Photograph (2914, <sup>e</sup><sub>i</sub>) and details were sent on Oct. 13th 1933.

In Woolley's Field Notes of An. 28, Chamber A, No. 16, are mentioned "blue glaze scarabs 11033, 11034 ((with drawings)), and one big (11136) and 2 small plain ones". Thus only two, not three, unnumbered scarabs are there mentioned. E. 11136: see Photos. 2823, 2830<sup>o</sup>, sent Oct. 26 ~~1932~~ 1932, and details sent Oct. 13 1933. Of the two unnumbered scarabs only one has been identified, see Photo. 2914, <sub>j</sub>, and details, sent Oct. 13 1933.

5. E. 11043: see Photos. 2909, 2910, sent Sept. 11 1933, and details sent <sup>then and on</sup> Oct. 13 1933. E. 11159: see Photo. 2830, sent Oct. 26 1932, and details sent Oct. 13 1933.

6. Drawing of E. 11032 ~~sent herewith~~ follows in a few days

7. Details of scaraboids and heart scarabs were sent Oct. 13 1933. I imagine that you do not require hand-copies of the inscriptions of the inscribed heart-scarabs, as they appear very clearly on the photos. sent you.

8. Woolley's Field Notes of An. 18, Chamber A, Nos. 12 to 14, are as follows:-

- 12. "Blue glaze scarab ((drawing)) 11016".
- 13. "Blue glaze scarab ((drawing)) 11017".
- 14. "Blue glaze scarab ((drawing)) 11014 B".

For these three scarabs see Photos. 898, 2822, sent Oct. 26 1932, and details sent Oct. 13 1933.

I was very glad to receive yesterday your cable "COPIES

POSTED". As soon as these copies of the Field Notes arrive they shall be quickly collated with the originals, and copies and originals then sent off to you. By the way, the cable address of this Museum is "Antique, Philadelphia".

Please do not hesitate to ask me any number of questions about any difficulties in the Anibeh material; I shall be most pleased to answer them, and that as promptly as possible. I am having squeezes made of the inscribed stones; these squeezes will be inked in, and therefore all ready for reproduction. I seriously hope to be able to send you the very last of the Anibeh material within a week from today!

If you require drawings of any of the scarabs, I ~~w~~<sup>ill</sup> do my best to make them; alternatively, I could perhaps ~~send~~ have better photographs made of some of them.
